The meeting was called to order by David R. Brackett, Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, with the Pledge to the flag.

Minutes of the meeting held on January 3, 2018, were read and approved.

Superintendent Granger reported on the following:

- 1. Water main breaks were reported at the following locations and dates:
 - Soundview and Fisherman's Drives on 1.3.2018
 - Soundview and Driftwood Drives on 1.4.2018
 - 127 Cow Neck Road on 1.4.2018
 - Pepperday Ave and Radcliff Road on 1.9.2018

The water main breaks with the exception of 127 Cow Neck Road were successfully repaired by Water District personnel. The 127 Cow Neck Road main break was repaired by Bancker Construction. The contractor was called in on an emergency basis since, Water District personnel were working continuously on the Soundview Drive water main breaks. Water District staff also needs to perform snow removal activities at the plans so staffing was limited for the 127 Cow Neck Road repair.

- 2. Provided the Board with a water main break summary for the Soundview Drive / Cow Neck Road area.
- 3. Reported that overall pumpage for 2017 was down 12.2 percent when compared to the prior year. Warm weather pumpage from May through September was also down by 18.4 percent which was better than the NYSDEC goal of reducing warm weather pumpage by 15 percent. The cooler and wetter summer conditions along with Water District conservation efforts factored into the decrease in water demand.
- 4. A kickoff meeting was held with Watertrax this week for implementation of the online data management service for water quality. The service should be fully functional by the end of March.

At 8:15 am Commissioner Brackett announced that bids would be opened for the following contracts: Contract No. 2018-01 – Annual Distribution System Repair & Maintenance

- 1. Beacon Hill Road Tank Replacement The large crane has been mobilized to the site. Remaining steel will be transported to the project site today.
- 2. Neulist Electrical Upgrade The project is substantially completed and is in the punch list phase.
- 3. Neulist Tank Evaluation working on plans and specifications for the tank repair and site clearing phase.

Peter Fishbein, Esq. - No report.

Old / New Business

Michael Michel and Claudia Breckling of Michel & Associates Landscape Architects discussed final site restoration and landscaping options for the Beacon Hill Road water tank site.
