The meeting was called to order by David Brackett, Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, with the Pledge to the flag.

Minutes for the meetings held on January 20, 2021 were read and approved.

Superintendent Vacchio reported on the following:

1. Requested to have Atlantic Wells Inc. to make an emergency repair to the Davis Vault doors in the amount of \$6,000.00. Approved
2. Discussed with the Board and Peter Fishbein the NYS Department of Health guidance on the covid-19 pandemic.

William Merklin and Michael Savarese, P.E. reported on the following:

1. Davis Ave Regulating Vault Repair - Visited site with Atlantic Wells (original installation contractor) to access damage and proposed repair.
2. Soundview Area Water Main - Reviewed Cow Neck water main record and determined it was originally intended to be included in the Soundview Area project, however, due to a five-year paving moratorium was removed from the scope.
3. Stonytown AOP Treatment – Prepared detailed design. Researching alternatives for nitrate plant layout

and associated land acquisition.

Checks for payment of claims, due from the Port Washington Water District totaling \$23,865.97 were approved for payment by the Board.
